

¶ At the beginning of Morning Prayer the Minister shall read with a loud voice one or more of these Sentences of the Scriptures that follow.

**Minister:**

*To the Lord our God belong mercies and forgiveness, though we have rebelled against him: neither have we obeyed the voice of the Lord our God, to walk in his laws which he set before us. (Daniel Chapter 9: 9, 10.)*

*EARLY beloved brethren, the Scripture moveth us, in sundry places, to acknowledge and confess our manifold sins and wickedness; and that we should not dissemble nor cloke them before the face of Almighty God our heavenly Father; but confess them with an humble, lowly, penitent, and obedient heart; to the end that we may obtain forgiveness of the same, by his infinite goodness and mercy. And although we ought, at all times, humbly to acknowledge our sins before God; yet ought we most chiefly so to do, when we assemble and meet together, to render thanks for the great benefits that we have received at his hands, to set forth his most worthy praise, to hear his most holy Word, and to ask those things that are requisite and necessary, as well for the body as the soul. Wherefore I pray and beseech you, as many as are here present, to accompany me, with a pure heart, and humble voice, unto the throne of the heavenly grace, saying after me:*

**ALMIGHTY and most merciful Father, We have erred and strayed from thy ways like lost sheep: We have followed too much the devices and desires of our own hearts: We have offended again, thy holy laws: We have left undone those things which we ought to have done; And we have done those things which we ought not to have done; And there is no health in us. But thou, O Lord, have mercy upon us, miserable offenders: Spare thou them, O God, which confess their fault: Restore thou them that are penitent; According to thy promises declared unto mankind in Christ Jesus our Lord. And grant, O most merciful Father, for his sake, That we may hereafter live a godly, righteous, and sober life, To the glory of thy holy Name. Amen.**

*¶ Then, the Minister shall kneel, and say the Lord's Prayer with an audible voice: the people also kneeling, and repeating it with him:*

**OUR Father, which art in heaven, Hallowed be thy Name; Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done in earth, as it is in heaven: Give us this day our daily bread; And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive them that trespass against us; And lead us not into temptation, But deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.**

**Mnstr:** O Lord, open thou our lips;

**Ans.** And our mouth shall shew forth thy praise.

**Mnstr:** O God, make speed to save us.

**Ans.** O Lord, make haste to help us.

*¶ Here all standing up, the Minister shall say,*

*Glory be to the Father, and to the Son: and to the Holy Ghost;*

**Ans:** As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be world without end. Amen.

**Mnstr:** *Praise ye the Lord.* **Ans.** The Lord's Name be praised.

*¶ Then shall be said or sung this Psalm*

PSAL. 95

**Come, let us sing unto the Lord: let us heartily rejoice in the strength of our salvation.**

**Let us come before his presence with thanksgiving: and show ourselves glad in him with psalms.**

**For the Lord is a great God: and a great King above all gods.**

**In his hands are all the corners of the earth: and the strength of the hills is his also.**

**The sea is his, and he made it: and his hands prepared the dry land.**

**O come, let us worship and fall down: and kneel before the Lord our Maker.  
For he is the Lord our God: and we are the people of his pasture, and the sheep of his hand.  
To day if ye will hear his voice, harden not your hearts: as in the provocation, and as in the day of  
temptation in the wilderness; When your fathers tempted me: proved me, and saw my works.  
Forty years long was I grieved with this generation and said: It is a people that do err in their hearts, for  
they have not known my ways.  
Unto whom I sware in my wrath: that they should not enter into my rest.**

### **First Lesson**

*Here beginneth such a Book: 2 Samuel 7:1-14a*

*And it came to pass, when the king sat in his house, and the LORD had given him rest round about from all his enemies;*

*That the king said unto Nathan the prophet, See now, I dwell in an house of cedar, but the ark of God dwelleth within curtains.*

*And Nathan said to the king, Go, do all that is in thine heart; for the LORD is with thee.*

*Now therefore so shalt thou say unto my servant David, Thus saith the LORD of hosts, I took thee from the sheepcote, from following the sheep, to be ruler over my people, over Israel:*

*And I was with thee whithersoever thou wentest, and have cut off all thine enemies out of thy sight, and have made thee a great name, like unto the name of the great men that are in the earth.*

*Moreover I will appoint a place for my people Israel, and will plant them, that they may dwell in a place of their own, and move no more; neither shall the children of wickedness afflict them any more, as beforetime, And as since the time that I commanded judges to be over my people Israel, and have caused thee to rest from all thine enemies. Also the LORD telleth thee that he will make thee an **house**. And when thy days be fulfilled, and thou shalt sleep with thy fathers, I will set up thy seed after thee, which shall proceed out of thy bowels, and I will establish his kingdom. He shall build an house for my name, and I will stablish the throne of his kingdom for ever. I will be his father, and he shall be my son.*

## **The Second Lesson**

***Reader: Here beginneth such a Book Ephesians, Chapter 2: Verse 11 through 22***

*Wherefore remember, that ye being in time past Gentiles in the flesh, who are called Uncircumcision by that which is called the Circumcision in the flesh made by hands; That at that time ye were without Christ, being aliens from the commonwealth of Israel, and strangers from the covenants of promise, having no hope, and without God in the world: But now in Christ Jesus ye who sometimes were far off are made nigh by the blood of Christ. For he is our peace, who hath made both one, and hath broken down the middle wall of partition between us; Having abolished in his flesh the enmity, even the law of commandments contained in ordinances; for to make in himself of twain one new man, so making peace; And that he might reconcile both unto God in one body by the cross, having slain the enmity thereby: And came and preached peace to you which were afar off, and to them that were nigh. For through him we both have access by one Spirit unto the Father. Now therefore ye are no more strangers and foreigners, but fellow citizens with the saints, and of the household of God; And are built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Jesus Christ himself being the chief*

*corner stone; In whom all the building fitly framed together groweth unto an holy temple in the Lord: In whom ye also are builded together for an habitation of God through the Spirit.*

And he said unto them, Come ye yourselves apart into a desert place, and rest a while: for there were many coming and going, and they had no leisure so much as to eat. And they departed into a desert place by ship privately. And the people saw them departing, and many knew him, and ran afoot thither out of all cities, and outwent them, and came together unto him. And Jesus, when he came out, saw much people, and was moved with compassion toward them, because they were as sheep not having a shepherd: and he began to teach them many things. And when they had passed over, they came into the land of Gennesaret, and drew to the shore.
